How to find yourself in the Polish reality?



We are pleased to present you the first guide to the Police Poviat regarding your stay in the municipalities of: Police, Dobre, Kołbaskowo and Nowe Warpn, developed by the West Pomeranian Folk High School in Mierzyn as part of the project "Information Center for Foreigners in the Police Poviat". This guide answers the most important questions and presents the key institutions and organizations supporting citizens of other countries in the process of acclimatization in Poland. We hope you will find this study useful.

With the large migration of Ukrainian citizens due to the current political situation in Ukraine, the guide was deliberately divided into two parts: the first one dedicated to people who arrived from Ukraine, and the second one dedicated to other foreigners living in our region.

How to acquire a PESEL number? (applies to Ukrainian citizens)

A citizen of Ukraine whose stay pursuant to Art. 2 clause 1 of the special act for Ukraine is legal, he or she may submit a personal application for a PESEL number at any executive body of the municipality in the territory of the Republic of Poland. On behalf of a person without legal capacity or with limited legal capacity, the application may be submitted by: one of the parents, guardian, probation officer, temporary guardian, the person with custody of the child. A person over 12 years of age signs the application for a PESEL number with their own hand. The application should be accompanied by one photo that meets the requirements of the photo attached to the application for an ID card.

obtain a Trusted Profile.

In the municipality of Kołbaskowo:

If a foreigner registers in Kołbaskowo for a stay of more than 30 days - the PESEL number will be assigned to them automatically. If a foreigner cannot register in Kołbaskowo and needs a PESEL number, they should submit an application to the City or Municipality Office in Kołbaskowo.

In the municipality of Nowe Warpno, a citizen of Ukraine must submit the following documents to the Municipal Office in Nowe Warpno:

- Application for granting a PESEL number to a citizen of Ukraine due to the armed conflict.
- A document confirming the applicant's identity and the data contained in the application,
- A current, color photo with dimensions of 32x45 mm, made in accordance with the requirements (check the criteria here:

How to get a trusted profile? What is a trusted profile for?

A trusted profile is a confirmed set of data that uniquely identifies its holder in the services of public entities on the Internet. This data includes first name(s), surname, date of birth and PESEL number. A trusted profile is secured in such a way that no one – except its owner – can use it. The user ID of a **trusted profile** is created automatically together with the assignment of a PESEL number and is sent to the applicant to the e-mail address provided in the application for a PESEL number or in the form of a printout of the confirmation of creating a trusted profile. A one-time password enabling the activation of a trusted profile by the applicant is sent to the mobile phone number provided in the application.

How to obtain a temporary residence permit and visa extension?

A citizen of Ukraine whose stay pursuant to Art. 2 clause 1 of the special act for Ukraine is or was considered legal, a temporary residence permit is granted upon their request. A temporary residence permit is granted once for a period of 3 years, counting from the date of issuing the decision. A temporary residence permit is granted by the voivode of a given voivodeship, taking into account the place of residence of a Ukrainian citizen on the day of submitting the application. By law, the period of stay on the basis of a national visa and the validity period of a national visa issued to a citizen of Ukraine, whose last day of stay in the territory of the Republic of Poland falls on the period from February 24th 2022, are extended util December 31st 2022. If the last day of validity of residence cards, Polish identity documents of a citizen of Ukraine, "consent for tolerated stay" documents issued to Ukrainian citizens falls withing the period from February 24th 2022, it is extended for a period of 18 months.

How do I get access to free medical care?

Ukrainian citizens are entitled to receive healthcare benefits to the same extent as Polish citizens covered by compulsory or voluntary health insurance. People who are not vaccinated against Covid-19 can do it in facilities that implement these vaccinations on the same terms as Polish citizens. Ukrainian citizens are not entitled to: spa treatment, spa rehabilitation, medical products issued under the health policy programs of the minister of health

How to get access to education?

On March 14th 2022, online learning was launched – the Ukrainian Ministry of Education, together with Google Ukraine, created a nationwide curriculum. It can be used by evacuated children and adolescents up to 18 years of age with limited access to education. The online learning platform can be found at mon.gov.ua. According to Polish law, people up to the age of 18 are subject to compulsory school education. If a child does not use online learning, launched by the Ukrainian Ministry of Education, the legal guardian of the child who is a Ukrainian citizen reports the child to the selected school. The school head teacher qualifies the child to the appropriate class and, if necessary, directs to the additional classes to improve the level of knowledge of the Polish language.

How to get a job?

A citizen of Ukraine is entitled to perform work in the territory of the Republic of Poland during the period of stay in accordance with the applicable regulations, if the entity entrusting the performance of work notifies the Poviat Labor Office within 14 days from the date of starting work by the citizen of Ukraine, via the ICT system: https://praca.gov.pl.

The https://zielonalinia.gov.pl website additionally provides all information related to the possibility of employing people from Ukraine, also available in Ukrainian.

Ukrainian citizens may undertake and conduct business activity in the territory of Poland on the same terms as Polish citizens, provided that they obtain a PESEL number in advance. A citizen of Ukraine may register and be recognized as unemployed or looking for a job.

Information Point employees provide the citizens of third-world countries with information on:

- ways of legal employment in Poland,
- family benefits due to citizens third-world countries,
- information on institutions that provide additional assistance and the types of this assistance.

In addition, the Point provides information brochures on help given to the citizens of third-world countries.

Aid Center for Migrants and Refugees in Szczecin

At the information and advisory point, you can get help, obtain information, and receive specialist legal, psychological, professional and integration assistance. As part of integration counseling, you can access a computer, Internet, printer or help with writing letters. In addition, the Aid Center for Migrants and Refugees provides help in translating documents regrading, inter alia, legalization of stay, validation of certificates, diplomas or medical documentation

Social and living support: social and living support consisting in the provision of packages with hygiene products, funding for necessary drugs or minor medical procedures, funding for clothes or renting a flat or a dormitory.

Legal counseling: under which you can get help in legalizing your stay in Poland, obtaining a work permit, understanding and interpretation of official letters, writing letters and applications, as well as assistance in representing foreigners before the authority during the procedure for issuing a residence permit.

Adaptation courses aimed at facilitating the social and civic integration of foreigners by making them aware of civic rights and obligations, and issues related to security.

Vocational guidance: information on the labor market, vocational education for adults, the qualification system in Poland and legal employment agencies. You can also get help in preparing official letters, translating and understanding the forms required during employment procedures. Advice is also provided on the types of employment contracts and civil law contracts, rules for using labor market institutions, tax settlement (e.g., on the tax system, settlement of the annual PIT tax return, obtaining the NIP number, REGON [Register of National Economy] number).

Psychological counseling-you can use psychological sessions that will allow you to raise your self-esteem, consciously manage your career, and effectively build your image on the labor market. Beneficiaries will receive support in difficult times of change and job search, related to job loss and long-term unemployment.

Running a common room, where children are looked after by a teacher. As part of the common room, there will be, among others, compensatory and educational classes and thematic classes for children. Periodical meetings with culture will be organized: visits to, for example, museums, cinemas, theaters and meetings with representatives of the world of culture and art.
